

Meeting the needs and expectations of adolescents and young migrants in reproductive health will help improve the quality of services and encourage young people to adopt healthy behaviors. The overall objective of this study is to identify the priority needs and expectations of adolescents and young migrants in the city of Rabat in the area of Reproductive Health. In fact, we conducted our mixed descriptive study using a questionnaire administered to a sample of three hundred young Francophone sub-Saharan migrants; associated with five focus groups with young people and eight interviews with stakeholders with young people chosen in a reasoned way.

We found that the level of knowledge and behaviors of young migrants with respect to some components of reproductive health are advanced (ie, STIs) (81%). However, young people had insufficient knowledge of gender-based violence (6%), contraception (61.52%), while cervical and breast cancer (10%) and against the manifestations of puberty (59%). Young people have risky behavior that threatens their lives (rape, sexual assault, STI / AIDS, unwanted pregnancy, abortion, drug abuse). Young people demand specialized care from a young and competent youth health staff, based on a warm welcome, confidentiality and respect for privacy. Regarding infrastructure, young people would like to have modern architectural spaces and they proposed to be involved in the programming and implementation of activities that concern them. In terms of information, there was a difference in needs according to sex and level of education. The places of care, namely listening centers, young health areas and health centers are favored by young people to talk about their concerns about Reproductive Health. In the light of these results, four strategic axes have been proposed to meet the priority needs and expectations of young migrants in Reproductive Health, namely: Access to quality services, the right to information on the health of children. Reproduction and development of an environment for community participation and ways of caring for survivors of gender-based violence (GBV).
